Evidence 19: "In Honour...Davison" From Suffragette, June 13, 1913



Introduction

Emily Wilding Davison killed herself by running in front of the King's horse during the Derby. This public act of suicide galvanized public opintion around the questions of women's suffrage and the militant tactics employed by the suffragettes.
